

Frequently Asked Questions – 2011 Season

1. What night does my child play?

In – House Divisions (Boys and Girls together) – U4 & U5 starting May 28th (no long weekend soccer)
U6 - starts week of May 23rd

- **U4** – Saturday am - 1 hour, 9:30 – 10:30 - alternating between Beeton & Tottenham
- **U5** – Saturday am – 1hour, 9:30 – 10:30 - alternating between Beeton & Tottenham
- **U6** - Monday & Thursday evenings, 1 game night & 1 practice night

Local Leagues – (Separate Boys and Girls divisions)

U7/8 – TDSC + Cobras – starts week of May 23rd – week of Aug 15th

- U7/8 Boys – Wednesday game & Monday practice
- U7/8 Girls - Monday game & Wednesday practice

U9/10 – TDSC + Cobras – starts week of May 23rd – week of Aug 15th

- U9/10 Boy – Tuesday game & Thursday practice
- U9/10 Girls – Thursday game & Tuesday practice

U11/12 – starts week of May 23rd

- U11/12 Boys – TBD
- U11/12 Girls – TBD

Simcoe County Soccer League (SCSL) – travel within Simcoe – starts week of May 23rd for U12-U18.
U21 starts week of May 15th. All game nights are tentative.

- U12B – Tuesday U12G – Monday
- U13B – TBD U13G – TBD
- U14B – Wednesday U14G – Thursday
- U15B – TBD U15G – Tuesday
- U16B – Monday U16G – Wednesday
- U18B – Tuesday U18G – Thursday

When will we be notified of a start date?

- U4, U5 – Should receive calls week of May 23rd.
- U6 – Should receive calls week of May 23rd
- U7/8 – Should receive calls week of May 9th – week of May 16th.
- U12 – U21 – Should receive calls May 2nd – week May 9th.

- ### 2. What does my registration fee cover?
- Registration and insurance with Ontario Soccer Association, uniform (shirt, shorts and socks), a soccer ball, individual and team photo, year-end Awards Day and entry into one tournament for players U6 – U18. Wrap up day for U4 & U5
- ### 3. What do I need to supply for my child to play soccer?
- Shin pads are mandatory and soccer cleats are recommended. You should also always provide a drink for your child at both games and practices. Bring your soccer ball to each practice.

4. **How do I determine which division my child will play in?**

5. **How much travel is involved in the travel league (SCSL)?** A season is made up of about 15 games. Half of these games will be played at home. Participating clubs can include as an example Cookstown, Barrie, Innisfil, Wasaga Beach, Orillia and Bracebridge. Not all teams travel to the same centres.

6. **Can my child be on the same team as his/her friend?** Once your child reaches U6 we cannot accommodate placing friends on the same team. We try very hard to balance teams based on players' abilities. It is very likely you will know someone on the team.
7. **Can my child play if he/she was born in 2008?** No, we do not accept registrations for any child born after Dec. 31 2007. There is no exception to this rule.
9. **How does my child become a referee?** All children who have turned 14 by March 31, 2010 are eligible to take the C4 clinic. All children who turn 12 on or before March 31st are eligible to take the Mini Soccer Referee Clinic. TDSC will be offering this clinic. Date to be determined. 10. **Tournaments** – We hold two tournaments each season and it is mandatory for our coaches to enter their teams into the appropriate tournament.
